FROM OAKLAND, BERKELEY

Highway 24 east exiting left onto Highway 680 north. Take the Ygnacio Valley Rd. exit and go 1.1 mi to the light. Turn right on Ygnacio Valley Rd.and go 2.9 mi. Turn left on North Wiget Ln. and go 0.1 mi. The Shadelands Arts Center parking lot is on the left.

FROM SACRAMENTO, CONCORD, PLEASANT HILL

Highway 680 south to Exit 48 Treat Blvd/Geary Rd. Take exit and continue 0.3 mi. to the light. Turn left on N. Main and go 0.2 mi. to Geary Rd and turn left. Go for 1.1 mi. on Geary Rd/

AT OUR **NOVEMBER** MEETING

November is the time of the year that we look back, reflect and give thanks for all that we enjoy in this life. For Carol Klonowski that includes orchids, which give her and the rest of us great joy. Carol selected one of her favorite type of orchids, Dendrobiums, to talk about with her fellow D.V.O.S. members during our fall meeting.

In the orchid kingdom, Dendrobiums are the second largest orchid genus behind Bulbophyllums. They are comprised of over 1200 species and are widely grown commercially for cut flowers and potted plants. To know how to grow them, you need to know where they originate and their native climates. Dendrobiums come from the equatorial areas of the world. They typically receive 10 to 12 hours of bright sunlight per day, year round. All dendrobiums like the bright light, but do not like direct sunlight or they will burn. All dendrobiums have fine roots and therefore need only small pots with welldraining media to thrive.



There are two kinds of dendrobiums; evergreen and deciduous. The evergreen types don't lose their leaves in the fall and winter. They require water even in the winter months. Some evergreen types do require a slight rest from your regular watering schedule, but not much of a rest. These evergreen types come from the areas of the world where they receive rainfall year round.

The second type of dendrobium is deciduous. These require a definite dry rest in the winter and go into a state of dormancy. During the winter they will drop their leaves and need no food or water for months. When they emerge in the spring from this dormancy, they immediately start the blooming cycle.

Carol then went into greater detail breaking down the evergreen Dendrobiums into four different types. These are Antelope, Latouria, Pedilonium and the Australian. At this point I need to summarize and boil down this information into some general and specific cultural points. In general, even evergreen Dendrobiums need less water in the winter time. This constitutes somewhat of a cool rest. If you stop watering evergreens altogether, the leaves will drop on these Dendrobiums. You don't need to fertilize these orchids in the winter time, only when the new roots and new growth start showing in the springtime. One specific note: *Dendrobium kingianum*, which is an evergreen, also needs a much reduced water schedule in the winter time. If you do water it normally, it won't die, but will make keiki's (small plantlets) instead of flowers.





The cultural needs of the deciduous Dendrobium are minimal. In the winter time, these orchids will look dead and lose their leaves. These orchids require a dry cool winter rest or else they will never bloom for you. This means that they need no water or food in the winter. Winter starts the day after Thanksgiving. You still need to provide them with bright light, good air movement and high humidity during their dormancy.
