These plants enjoy high humidity but need to be kept on the dry side as their roots easily rot. Native to the Carribean, these plants need quality water with low salt content.

## Culture Corner

Last month Matt Swift of Swift's orchids shared his tips for successfully growing equitants. Matt uses clay pots or plastic net pots as his experience has been that the solid plastic pots stay too wet for his growing conditions. He sterilizes clay pots by baking them at 350°F for 1 hour. He pots the equitants in a mix of equal parts fine fir bark, #3 perlite and pea sized gravel. To prepare your media, wash the dust out of the gravel and perlite before adding to your mix. Soak the bark and discard any material that sinks to the bottom.

He recommends repotting in the spring or summer when there is active growth. The pot you use should be able to accommodate 1 or 2 fans of growth, but don't use anything larger than a 4" pot. In Matt's experience, anything larger than a 4" pot stays too wet and tends to rot the roots. Be sure that the hole at the bottom of the pot is kept clear to allow the pot to 'breathe'.

With this technique he finds he only needs to water twice a week in summers and once a week in the winter. He advises that if you do mount these plants, don't use moss as they don't like persistent wet feet. Keep the humidity high and provide good quality water as they don't tolerate high salt content. You should provide lots of indirect sunlight (cattleya conditions) and fertilize at <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> strength recommended on the label. If you find you only get a few flowers per stem, you should increase the amount of light your plant receives.

As always, whenever trying new techniques, try it first on only a few sample plants and view the results before applying changes on a larger scale. What works well in a given set of conditions may not work well in different conditions.

In July, fellow DVOS member Michael Gallagher has kindly rescheduled his culture session "Growing Disas in the East Bay" If you want to grow these continous bloomers you won't want to miss this culture topic.
