February is Academy Awards month where awards are given for a variety of categories in the motion picture business. Best Actor or Actress, Best Sound Editing, Best Film Editing, Best Musical Score and of course, the granddaddy of them all, Best Picture. This year's winner for Best Picture was given to "Birdman".

DVOS was treated to an exclusive, unedited, uncut, never before seen in public raw footage viewing of "Birdman". It was a classic **Sung Lee** big budget production with lead actor **Jim Wert** performing on a backstage lot somewhere in Berkeley, California. The opening scene shows the protagonist (Jim Wert) in a plastic lawn chair surrounded by the environment that he himself has obviously chosen as a way of life. Orchids behind him, a flock of birds, chickens, off to the side, and a hundred or so flies circling overhead. It appears to be an austere existence, some might even describe as Spartan.

This storyline is as old as time. A man sits there in his chair and describes how he was once set in life. He had everything you could ever want and craved nothing, but was somehow still unfulfilled.

He had the love of a beautiful wife, a good job, a well-furnished, and comfortable home and a simple yard to maintain. This lifestyle went on for many years, then suddenly, a new love caught Jim's eye. At first he was lured in by the sight of this exotic beauty, then the intoxicating smell. Although he was already committed to his wife, he felt that this new love was something that he had been longing for all his life. This new love of his would be called orchids. As the movie progresses, Jim describes just how he pursued his new passion, starting out on a very small scale with just one at a time. Puppy love if you will. Then with time, his love of orchids multiplied and began to take over his life. Jim paid a dear price for this choice. He was immediately relegated to the outside world where it was just him and his greenhouse full of orchids. His wife still lives in the house adjacent to the property where Jim and his new love reside. It seems to be a very strange living situation but apparently it's Berkley and the notion of free love is still respected. There is some rare footage from "Birdman" where Jim is actually seen inside the house sitting in a comfortable chair reflecting on how his life used to be. His entire monologue continues to speak about his new love orchids.

The final scene shows the birdman in his element. He is feeding his flock of chickens then taking the straw from beneath their feet and thrusting that straw into the ground, working the straw into the soil then defiantly raising his blackened hands as if to show society that its rules about hand hygiene don't apply to him.

As the house lights were raised the DVOS audience was clearly impressed by the passion shown by lead actor Jim Werts. To many in the audience, it represented the love that they also had experienced somewhere in their past and had to face that same hard choice in life.




D & D Flowers Spring Open-house May 2nd & 3rd, 2015 9:00 am to 3 pm

At the new location on 169 1st Avenue Daly City, CA 94014 (D&D Flowers is not open to the public except during the spring and fall scheduled open houses)

Directions 280 South from San Francisco: Take the Eastmoore exit and veer to the right onto Sullivan Avenue. At the stop light, make a right onto Washington Street (service station on the right and Krispy Kream Donut at opposite corner). Go over the freeway, through Junipero Serra Blvd to San Pedro (Catholic Church at intersection). Make a left onto San Pedro and continue through Mission Street between Bank of America and Wendy's. At the stop sign, make a left

onto 1st Avenue. Greenhouse is on the right hand side of the 3rd house with the red garage and a sign reading Demattei Nursery. Enter the gate of the chain link fence with red lattice on the left hand side of the red garage.

Directions 280 north of Hicky Blvd.: Take the Pacifica/Eastmoore Avenue exit and veerto the right to the Eastmoore Avenue exit. At the stop light, you would like to be on the 2nd lane to the left. Turn left onto Junipero Serra Blvd and at the stop light; make a right turn onto San Pedro Road. Then continue through Mission Street between
