

Charles Baker Passed away 8/30/09

 \mathbf{L} t is with great sadness that I announce the passing of my father,

Charles (aka Charlie) Baker, pronounced dead at 12:15 this afternoon (Sunday, August 30, 2009). His final hours were peaceful, a blessing to all concerned, and we are thankful his cancer ran its course relatively quickly with a minimum of suffering.

It was his wish that there be no funeral nor even mention in the obituaries. In typical Charlie fashion, he felt it was preferable to honor people while they were still alive, useless to do it afterwards. Nevertheless, a memorial for Charlie is being planned for (as yet) some unspecified date in the future, such details will be emailed as soon as we figure it out.

In the meantime, please take a moment to honor the passing of an extraordinary man. He loved us all, and we loved him. - Bruce Baker

Charles and his wife Marge wrote 3-4 books on orchids and were best known for their culture sheets which utilized data from weather stations around the globe to give hobbyists an inkling about annual conditions in the regions where orchid species grow. To know annual fluctuations in temperatures, humidity and bloom times is essential in growing orchid species well and Charles and Marge gave our hobby information of inestimable value. Much of this data is housed in the Orchid Wiz program. Much of it is online at orchidculture.com. Marge passed away some years ago. They spoke at the DVOS 15 years ago giving us clear spoken, level headed and no nonsense cultural advice, unlike a lot of the mythology that surrounds orchid culture.

Their best known books include a guide to Dendrobiums as well as a guide to Phalaenopsis. There are few serious articles on orchid species culture that do not reference Charlie and Marge Baker's culture and weather data. - K. Barrett
